The Portsmouth Site is home to a **Cold War-era** gaseous diffusion uranium enrichment facility that supported the nation's nuclear defense and energy needs from 1954-2001. Today the Portsmouth site has moved into a new phase with environmental cleanup, waste removal and decontamination and decommissioning of the original gaseous diffusion buildings.


